

Palliser Regional Park

Rules and Regulations

1. Permit holders shall **NOT** rent, sell, sublet, assign or otherwise transfer the assigned site or the site with camping unit on it. Camping units must be registered to the lessee of the site and are for the use of the permit holder and immediate family unless permission is granted from the Campground Office.
2. Only one camping unit shall be allowed per site. Sites are allowed one tent for accommodation of minor children, dining tents are acceptable. Any other units temporarily on the site will have to pay the daily camping fee applicable.
3. Sites are not to be surrounded by tarps. No item is to be NAILED to a tree.
4. The permit holder is responsible for hooking up to sewer properly and maintenance of the sewer line. The permit holder is also responsible for water hook up and must include the check valve in the system. The water and sewer facilities will be shut off on scheduled dates established by the Maintenance Supervisor in order to complete winterization before freeze up. The Park reserves the right to shut the water off earlier in case of emergency, weather, etc.
5. Sites are to be clean. Fixtures such as steps, patios, fences, or sheds must not be permanent and must be removable, along with the camping unit upon a 24 hour notice.
6. **All** vehicles entering the park must purchase *and display* a seasonal pass or the daily pass on the upper left hand corner of the windshield so it can be easily visible. The pass must be attached to the windshield.
7. The permit holder, his/her guests, and their families shall at all times comply with all permit conditions and regulations. All campers, **including seasonal**, will observe Quiet Time (11:00 p.m. – 7:00 a.m.) and refrain from loud and disruptive gathering (either day or night) at their campsite.
8. All pets at the campsite must be kept under physical control by a leash or enclosed pet run. Two pets per site only. Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets. Pets are not permitted to be left unattended. Dogs must be kept under control including excessive barking.
9. Alcoholic beverages may be consumed only in the permit holder's campsite and on his/her assigned site and in accordance with the requirements of The Alcohol Control Act. Please note: there is a ban on alcohol in the Park for the May long weekend each year.

10. Applications for any development of your site may be obtained from the Campground Office and must be approved before any work commences or any structures are brought into the site. A building permit must be purchased for \$20.00 upon approval. All development on the sites that cannot be removed is leasehold improvements and belongs to the Park when you move or give up your site.

11. Failure to comply with any condition or regulation could result in eviction and/or loss of the camping site and permit. Awarding of permits is under annual review.

12. SHEDS - Maximum size must be less than 100 square feet with 6' sidewalls. Sheds must be on skids for quick removal or relocation on 24 hours' notice, if required. Only one shed per site. Sheds must be only used for storage. At no time is a shed to be used as Guest quarters. Exterior must be finished with prefinished wood, vinyl or paintable. Shed must not obstruct your neighbor's view.

13. PERMITS - Applications for any development of your site may be obtained from the Campground Office and must be approved before any work commences or any structures are brought into the site. A building permit must be purchased for \$20.00 and a site plan must be submitted to the Park office for approval. All development on the sites that cannot be removed is leasehold improvements and belongs to the Park when you move or give up your site.

14. FENCES - All fences must be no taller than 6'. Fences can only be erected on the rear and sides and the front must remain open. The finish must be in earth tones or white. Approval is required before any fence can be erected.

15. DECKS - Must be 1.5 meters set back from the rear of the campsite and both sides. The deck must allow for the parking of your vehicle on your site. The deck is to be set on the ground unless the lay of the land prevents this, at which time the Park Manager must be consulted. Decks must be closed in on all sides to prevent rodents and other pests. Only new material can be used on the deck. No roof is allowed on the deck.

16. TRAILERS: Only one trailer plus a tent for children is allowed on each camping site. Piggy backing is allowed for a maximum of two weeks per season and must be booked and paid for at the Admissions Office (Gate). Site must allow for piggybacking (cannot obstruct traffic or infringe on neighbours). Tent trailers, extra trailers that do not qualify as piggy backing are not allowed. The storing of extra trailers on your site for the off season is not permitted.
